This book will teach you how to reach FOUR TARGETS. They are:

### 1. LOVING ALLAH AND FOLLOWING HIS COMMANDS

You should always love and follow all of Allah's commands like prayer, fasting, charity, Hajj etc. and NOT follow your evil desires e.g. playing games instead of praying to Allah, or disrespecting parents.

### 2. LOVING ALLAH'S MESSENGER (SALLALLAAHU ALAYHI WA SALLAM) AND FOLLOWING HIM

You should always try to love and follow the way of the Holy Prophet (Sallallahu Alayhi wa Sallam) in all your actions and to love and follow His life style as much as possible. Like his way of eating, drinking, talking, sleeping etc. He should be your star and role model of how to live your life, not pop stars, film actors or any other people.





### 3. BEING VERY KIND AND HAVING MERCY ON ALLAH'S CREATION

You should always try to look after the Creation of Allah so that you make Allah happy. Like your mum, dad, Teacher, siblings, friends, people, animals and so forth. You should try to be kind to them and try to make their lives better in this world by giving charity, helping people who are ill for example. You should also try to make their lives better in the hereafter by telling them about Islam so that they can go to heaven.

### 4. TO ALWAYS THINK ABOUT ALLAH

You should try to remember Allah with your heart and mind as much as possible throughout the day. Try to remember the three keys;

- 1) Allah is watching me
- 2) Allah is with me
- 3) Allah is listening/hearing me

(This helps build your friendship with Allah! If you think about Allah. Allah thinks of you.)

These are the four targets you need to aim for if you want to make Allah happy





### WHAT YOU WILL LEARN IN YEAR 1

In this book we will follow a Path which takes us to the Palace of the Pleasure of Allah (which contains all the Treasures of happiness). We will be going together with the Special one who knows all the secrets of the adventure we are about to take. He is known as the Teacher. In this Journey we will have to cross many checkpoints and levels.

In year 1 we will be covering the first part of the Journey to the land of Allah's Pleasure, which is to climb the Mountain of Four Checkpoints. The Four Checkpoints are to:

- 1. Learn the Seven Secrets of Success: You should learn the correct faith (Aqeedah) that a Muslim should have.
- 2. Learn the important Do's and Don'ts: You should learn the rules of how to clean yourself, do Wudhu, pray Salaah etc.
- 3. Fresh start: Saying sorry to Allah for the bad things you did in the past. If you have not followed Allah properly in the past or you have done something wrong to any of His creation, then you must try to fix that and ask forgiveness from Allah and His Creation as well.
- 4. Trying hard: In this Journey, the evil devils, your own evil desires (evil behaviour and wanting bad things) and evil people will be trying to stop you reaching your goal; Heaven and the Pleasure of Allah! Before you start the journey you must be strong and ready to battle against them.



### Time when there was only Allah and nothing else existed

If you look at the first box it shows us the time when only Allah (Subhaanahu wa Ta'Aala) existed alone and nothing else existed apart from Him. There was no sun, no moon, no stars, no earth, no humans. Absolutely nothing! Then later there came a time when the whole universe, including the sun, stars, planets and human beings came into existence.



Have you ever wondered how the whole universe, sun, stars, planets and us humans came into existence? You will probably say, "Everyone has a mother and father." But that answer is incorrect. After all, it does not explain how the first mother and father, that is, the first man, came into being. You may have heard some stories on this subject at school or from people around you. Yet the only true answer is that it is Allah Who created you. The first human being who Allah created on earth was the Prophet Adam (Alayhi salam). All other human beings came from him.



Allah has told us the reason why He has created everything. He says, "I was a hidden treasure, and I wished to be known, so I created a creation (humankind), then made Myself known to them, and they came to know Me."

In other words, Allah (Subhaanahu wa Ta'Aala) created human beings to worship Him. Human beings did not create themselves, that is why they cannot spend their life the way they want. Instead they must spend their life the way Allah (Subhaanahu wa Ta'Aala) wants them to live. This is the only way that they can be happy forever and ever. In Surah Mulk (In the Holy Qur'aan), Allah (Subhaanahu wa Ta'Aala) mentions "He has created death and life that He may test which one of you does the best deeds" (good action, behaviour, etc).

### World when we were Spirits (Souls only)

Now if you take a look at the second box. This is the first stage of our story, and is the place where Allah (Subhaanahu wa Ta'Aala) put us first when He made us, before we came onto planet earth. Yes that's right! At that time we had no bodies, we were just Spirits. In this world Allah (Subhaanahu wa Ta'Aala) asked the souls "Am I not your Lord (your Creator)". Every soul replied "Yes, Oh Allah you are our Lord". Every soul! Every person's soul who has come into this World has said this! Interesting!

In other words all the souls accepted that Allah (Subhaanahu wa Ta'Aala) is the Only God and promised Allah (Subhaanahu wa Ta'Aala) that if He sent them to planet earth they would worship Him with their own choice, not through force.

The other creations of Allah (Subhaanahu wa Ta'Aala) like the Sun, Moon, Mountains and Rivers have no choice in obeying Allah (Subhaanahu wa Ta'Aala). For example, the sun cannot say that today I don't feel like rising so I will take a rest, or the Mountains move from their places, but rather they have no choice.



It is only Human beings and Jinns (another invisible Creation - made of fire) that have been given the freedom to choose between listening to Allah (Subhaanahu wa Ta'Aala) and not listening to Allah. If they choose the right way they will be rewarded forever and ever in the Hereafter. However if they choose not to obey Allah (Subhaanahu wa Ta'Aala) then they will be punished in the Hereafter.

### Planet Earth - The place of test, competition and war

The second stage of our story is this world in which we are living in now. Out of all the different stages of your journey this is the most dangerous one. This is because it is the shortest one compared to the other stages and whatever you do in this life will affect what is going to happen to us forever and ever.

Some people believe that this world is only a place of fun and joy. They live to eat, drink, and enjoy life. However as Muslims we believe that we have been sent to this World for a short time to be tested. The test is whether we use our body to obey the command of Allah (Subhaanahu wa Ta'Aala) and follow the way of The Messenger of Allah (Sallallahu Alayhi wa Sallam), which is the Purpose of life. Or whether we will follow the devil and our own evil ways.

Allah tests some people by giving them good health to see whether they thank Him or not, while He tests others by giving them illnesses to see whether they are patient or impatient. He also tests some people by giving them lots of money, while He tests others by making them poor.

However unlike the tests and exams that we do at school, we do not have the option of resitting this test again, as once a person dies there is no return to planet earth, no second chance.

These are the two choices which we all have been given. As part of the test Allah has placed many different challenges to distract us, like the devil and evil ways. This has been done purposely to see who you choose; Allah, The Most Kind, OR the evil devil.



Look at the two examples shown below that explain how this life is a test:

1) You are playing on your computer game and having lots of fun. The time for prayer comes. What do you do? Leave your game and pray or continue to play?



OR

2) It is the month of Ramadhan. You are fasting and very hungry because you have not eaten all day. What do you do? Quickly eat a chocolate bar when no one is looking or control your hunger for a little while longer?



OR

Fast

You decide, but before you make your decision remember that all of these things in the world like games and food are going to finish as soon as you die. You can't take them with you to the grave. In fact how often do you play a computer game before you get bored of it? Or how long did you keep your trainers before you wanted a new pair?

However, in Heaven people will never ever get bored of the things they will be given and the fun will be never ending. They will be young forever and ever and they will be given whatever they wish for. Allah describes the short life of this world in many verses of the Qur'aan and reminds us that the real home of human beings is in the Hereafter (life after we die). A person who is tested in this world will one day die and start his eternal life in the Hereafter.



### Number of years spent on different activities During an average life span of 60 years

Take a look at the pie chart below. Even if a person lives a long life, for example 60 years, most of this time is wasted anyway. In a 60 years life, we spend 13 years in childhood, 22 years sleeping, 15 years in education and other years are wasted doing nothing and general things. The actual time which we spend living is about 6 years. In days this works out to be only 2,190. Even then there is no guarantee that we will reach that age as many of people die before that.



That is why it is very important that we don't waste our time as it is very precious and instead we should try to spend every moment worshipping Allah because once a second or minute is gone we will not get that second or minute back.

Insha' Allah later it will be explained how you can please Allah (Subhaanahu wa Ta'Aala) in this life and how to avoid displeasing Him.

### Death and the World beyond the grave

Some people think that death is the end of everything. But the truth is that death is a changeover from the life of this world to the life of the Hereafter. It is like a gate to the afterlife. On the other side of this gate, is the life of the Hereafter. Whether we will enter the Garden of Paradise or the Fire depends on our Belief in Allah and whether or not Allah is happy with our actions in this life. Death is the door to happiness or misery forever!



As previously mentioned, Allah has sent us in this world for a test and trial. However He has given a different length of trial to each person. Some live thirty years, while some others enjoy a life as long as one hundred years. Just as Allah decided your date of birth, which is the beginning of your time of test, Allah decides the time when this period will end. In other words, only Allah knows at which age you will die.



The Third stage of our story is the Grave. This is where a person will stay after death and until the Day of Final decision. From this moment onwards the choice of a person ends. His grave will either become a garden of enjoyment if he was a good person, or a pit of fire because of the bad deeds he did in the world.

We may think that when we are young we sometimes feel as though we will live forever. But this is not true. In fact there is no guarantee that we will even die old. If you pay a visit to the graveyard you will see this. The grandfather comes to the world first, then the father and finally the son. From a visit to the graveyard we can see that there is no order when leaving this world. Even though the grandfather comes into this world first the grandson may leave first.

There are many children buried in the graveyard, their lives finished before their expected time. There is no guarantee how long we will be living in this world and it is just a matter of time before we leave. So always try to do good so you can leave in a good way.

### The Day of Final Decision

The Fourth stage of our story is the Day of Final Decision. All Muslims believe that everything will die and come to an end, except Allah. After death Allah will bring us back to life on the Last Day, the Day of Final Decision.

On this day you will have to explain about each and every second spent in this world. In particular the days when you were young and when you grow older how you earned your money and what you spent it on.

You will also certainly be asked about how much you acted upon your knowledge i.e. what you knew about Islam. For the good people this day will pass very quickly. The bad people this Day may last for 50,000 years.

Everyone's actions that they did in the world will be weighed. Those who have done more good actions than bad will be given their books in the right hand and will be rewarded with Heaven. Those who have done more bad actions than good, will be given their books in their left hand and punished in Hellfire.

### Heaven and Hell

The final phase of our story will be in one of the two destinations forever. Heaven or Hell. These are the two separate places where people will spend their lives after the Day of Final Decision depending on what they were doing on the planet earth.

### Heaven

You might have been to places with beautiful Sceneries or seen breathtaking scenes in movies. There may be places you wished you had never left. Heaven is many times more beautiful than any of these places. The food good people will enjoy in Heaven is much more delicious than the food of this world. Allah, the Creator of all beauty in this world, tells us that He creates much greater beauty in the Garden for good Believers.



The Heaven of a normal person will be many times bigger than this world. Every person in Heaven will have the height of Prophet Adam, beauty of Prophet Yusuf, age of Prophet Isa, voice of Prophet Daud, and the Character of Prophet Muhammad (Peace be upon them all). Allah The Giver of peace, will speak directly to the people and show them His unmatched beauty. In Heaven there will be no sickness, death or any other problems. People will get whatever they can imagine. It will be for those people who have pleased Allah in this world.

### Hellfire

People who disobey Allah and refuse to believe in Him will also be repaid for what they did. They did not accept Allah (Subhaanahu wa Ta'Aala) or believe that He is the One Who creates everything and failed to do the acts of worship expected of them. In return for all this, they will be punished in the Fire.

Some people commit different crimes in this world. In situations where no one sees them, they may also go unpunished. But these people fail to understand that Allah sees them every moment, and that He even knows their inner thoughts.



The people who didn't believe in Allah and His Messenger (Sallallahu Alayhi wa Sallam) will live in the Hellfire forever. Those muslims that did bad things and died without asking for forgiveness from Allah will also go to Hell, unless they are forgiven by Allah, but will be taken out after a period of time after being washed from all the sins (like lying, stealing, swearing). Reason for this is that they did not clean themselves from the sins in this world so they will be cleansed in the Hellfire through punishment. Only people who have cleansed themselves from all their sins will be able to go to Heaven directly.







#### Four Targets

As shown on the diagram on the previous page, at the end of this journey you will reach the four targets. They are like having four skills or four qualities in you. Insh'Allah if you reach there one day with Allah's Mercy you will enter the Palace of the pleasure of Allah.

#### First Target - Choosing the Commands of Allah

The first target that you need to reach, so that you can enter the Palace of the pleasure of Allah is:

To always choose to follow and love all of Allah's command like prayer, doing your Salaah, fasting in the month of Ramadhan, doing your Dhikr, obeying your parents amongst many other things. In order to follow Allah's command you cannot follow your own evil desires or the evil devil.

One of the examples of following Allah's commands is to tell the truth and not to tell lies. So when you speak to your parents or your teachers you should never lie to them and always speak the truth because we know Allah will be happy with us. This is an example of choosing Allah's command to tell the truth and not following the devil by lying.

Let's see if you understand what I mean? One day Fatima was playing hop scotch outside with her friends. The time for Asar salah came. The shaitaan whispered in Fatima's ear tempting her not to do her Salaah and instead instructed her to continue playing hop scotch with her friends. What do you think Fatima did? Do you think she went inside to do her salaah or did she carry on playing?

Yes well done you are absolutely correct!!! Because Fatima knew that Allah and the Prophet (SallAllaho alaihi wa salam) would become extremely happy if she did her salaah on time Fatima told her friends to wait, she went inside her home, did Wudhu and did her Salaah. Alhamdulillah! Allah and the Prophet (SallAllaho alaihi wa salam) became very pleased with Fatima.

#### Second Target - Choosing to follow the Holy Prophet

The second target you need to reach is: To always choose to love and follow the life and way of the Holy Prophet (Sallallahu Alayhi wa Sallam) in all your actions as much as possible. As He (Sallallahu Alayhi wa Sallam) is the most beloved person to Allah and Allah loves all of his actions and manners. Allah has said that he will also love all those people who copy all of the actions and manners of the Prophet (Sallallahu Alayhi wa Sallam).

This means that you should copy the way He (Sallallahu Alayhi wa Sallam) ate. the way He drank, the way He spoke, how He slept and the clothes He wore amongst many other things.

He (Sallallahu Alayhi wa Sallam) is the most perfect human being. He never made any mistakes! Wow!! This means that we should make him our star and our role model. Not the pop stars, film actors, footballers or any other such people.

Let me give you an example of Yahyah who does everything according to the way the Holy Prophet (Sallallahu Alayhi wa Sallam) did them. Before he eats he washes his hands, wears a hat or turban, recites the eating Dua, sits on the floor in the sunnah way and eats with his right hand. Do you know something else amazing about Yahyah? When a grain of food drops on the ground, he picks it up, cleans it and then eats it.

So. eating in this way and following the Prophet (Sallallahu Alayhi wa Sallam's) way makes Allah and his Prophet (Sallallahu Alayhi wa Sallam) extremely happy. Gradually, we become closer and closer to the Prophet (Sallallahu Alayhi wa Sallam) and travel one step closer to the Palace of the Pleasure of Allah.

#### Third Target . To be kind and Herciful to the creation

The third target that you need to reach is: To be extra kind and have mercy on Allah's creation. Allah's creation includes your parents, brothers and sisters. Friends, teachers, old people, poor people, animals, insects, trees, plants, the environment, and many many other things as well, (can cartoon pies of trees, plants, flowers, birds, insects, a bumble bee buzzing around and sitting on Maryam's shoulder popup?)

Everything has been created by Allah and that is why Allah becomes happy with the person who is good to his creation and is extra kind to them.

For example, you should find happiness in helping someone in difficulty and always show care for the sick, old and the poor. The Holy Prophet (Sallallahu Alaghi wa Sallam) has said: "Allah will not show mercy to him who does not show mercy to athers." (Bukharae).

Once upon a time a girl called Salma was being hasty to Zohra by calling her boroible names which made Zohra very opset.

One day however. Salma lost all of her dinner money and she did not have anything to eat at lunchtime. Salma asked all of her classmates to land her some money but they refused to help her. Salma became very worried and began to cry.

Zohra Knew that if she helped Salma in her difficult situation then this would make Allah socoo happy and put a smile on the face of the Prophet (Sallallahu Alayhi wa Sallam). So Zohra forgot about the time when Salma was horrible to her and instead she shared her dinner money with her.

Salma was very surprised, she became regretful for being horrible to Zohra in the past. Both the girls became good friends.

Being extra kind to creation and helping them is a very important stage. We should try to do this all the time.

#### Fourth Target - To be thinking of Allah

The fourth Target you will reach is to think about Allah most of the time wherever you are.

This means that you will think that Allah is with you wherever you are. Allah is watching you whatever you are doing, and listening to whatever you say.

For example when you are in the Masjid and are proging you will be thinking about Allah. However, even when you go out of the Masjid you will not forget about Allah like most people do. Instead you will still be thinking about Allah wherever you are, even in the market, at school and even at home.

For example there is a boy named Adam who always thinks that Allah is with him. that Allah is watching his actions and Allah is even listening to him when he goes shapping.

Because Adam knows this, he is always on his best behaviour. Often Adam even speaks silently to Allah with his mind. Whilst he is in the market he says Oh Allah thank you for giving me a healthy body to walk to the market, cometimes he says Oh Allah help me to do my shopping with honesty and cometimes he says Oh Allah protect from any exil in the market.

Like this Adam never forgets about Allah, he is constantly thinking about him and that is why Adam hardly misbehaves.


#### Lesson 2 - Using the Toilet

Islam is a complete way of life. Islam teaches manners and habits for every part of our lives, even when we use the toilet. Islam teaches us respect and cleanliness, when using the toilet. Written below are some of the manners when going to the toilet:

- 1. We do not enter the toilet barefoot and bare head.
- 2. We do not face the Qiblah while passing urine (wee) or stool (poo).
- 3. We do not show our back to the Qiblah while passing urine or stool (poo).
- 4. We do not eat drink or talk in the toilet.
- 5. We do not read any books, or newspapers in the toilet.
- 6. We do not read Dua or Qur'aan in the toilet.
- 7. We do not enter the toilet with anything on which Allah's name can be seen.
- 8. No one must see you when you are in the toilet.
- 9. Make sure you leave the toilet clean after using it.

# Lesson 3 - The way of going to the toilet (Istinja')

Istinja' means washing the private parts after passing urine (wee) or stool (poo). Istinja' is done with water and toilet paper. Istinja' can also be done with pebbles if no water or toilet-paper is available. The one who does not do Istinja' is not Tahir, pure and clean.

The method of Istinja' and visiting the toilet is as follows:

1) Before entering the toilet recite this Dua' or supplication:

"Oh Allah, I seek your protection from all filth and impure creatures."

- 2) Enter the toilet with the left foot first.
- 3) Sit down when passing urine (wee) or stool (poo).
- 4) Using the left hand, wipe the private parts with toilet-paper first.
- 5) Wash the private parts with water, using the left hand again. You may use soap as well.
- 6) Dry the private parts with toilet paper, again with the left hand.
- 7) Wash both hands with water and soap.
- 8) Leave the toilet with the right foot first.
- 9) Recite this Dua after leaving the toilet:

"I seek your pardon (O Allah!). All Praise be to Allah Who has removed discomfort from me and granted me relief."

## Lesson 5 - Things you must do in Wudhu

There are some parts of the body that must be washed in Wudhu. If any of these parts remain dry, Wudhu is not complete. Salaah is not accepted without Complete Wudhu.

The things that you must do in Wudhu are:

- 1. To wash the full face.
- 2. To wash both the arms.
- 3. To make Masah of the head: Masah is to wipe with wet hands over one quarter of the head.
- 4. To wash both feet.

#### Lesson 6 - Practical Wudhu

Altogether there are 13 steps in Wudhu. We shall learn each step one by one. They are:

- 1) Before doing Wudhu say your intention (Niyyah).
  You can utter the intention "I have the intention to perform Wudhu for Salaah."
- 2) Then recite the following Dua': بِسْمِ اللَّهِ وَالْحَمْدُ لِلَّهِ

"In the Name of Allah, and all Praise be to Allah."

 Wash both hands up to the wrists three times. Begin with the right hand.

4) Rinse the mouth properly three times.





- 5) Rinse the nose three times.
- 6) Wash the face three times.






7) Wash the forearms up to the elbow three times. Begin with the right arm.

8) Pass wet hands over the head, front to back with fingers and then back to front again with palm of your hands.





9) Wipe the ears, inside and out, once.



10) Wipe the back of the neck with back of the hands, once.



11) Wash the feet up to the ankles three times. Begin with the right foot.



12) After completing the Wudhu recite the following Dua:

A Muslim who has Wudhu is pure and clean. When his Wudhu breaks, he is no longer pure and clean. He has to make Wudhu again before performing Salaah or reciting the Qur'aan.

#### Lesson 8 - Taking a bath (Ghusl)

Ghusl is a special method of washing the entire body to become clean from any uncleanliness. Ghusl is only complete if every part of our body is wet. A clean body is loved by Allah and protects us from germs and sickness. Water is a gift from Allah; we must not waste water when making Ghusl.

There are three things that you have to do when taking a bath. If any of these are left out then your Ghusl is not complete. They are:

- 1) To gargle the whole mouth.
- 2) To put water into the nostrils.
- 3) To pour water over the whole body.

## Lesson 9 - Salaah (Prayer)

Salaah means prayer. Salaah is the second pillar of Islam. When the time for Salaah comes we must stop all work and play and prepare ourselves for prayer. We should all be quiet and peaceful.

When offering Salaah we should feel as if we are standing in front of Allah and that He is looking at us. A Muslim speaks to Allah through Salaah. Salaah is the best way of worshipping Allah and being Thankful to Him.

Salaah has to be read five times a day at certain times as taught by the Holy Prophet (Sallallahu Alyhi wa Sallam). Just as we do not perform Hajj outside the appointed time, we cannot read Salah outside its appointed time. It is a great sin to read Salaah after the time has finished.


#### Lesson 10 - Positions of Salaah

One day a man entered the Masjid while the Holy Prophet (Sallallahu Alyhi wa Sallam) was sitting in the corner. He read Salaah and then came to give Salaam to the Holy Prophet (Sallallahu Alyhi wa Sallam). The Holy Prophet (Sallallahu Alyhi wa Sallam) returned his Salaam and told him to read his Salaah again. The man repeated his Salaah and returned to the Holy Prophet (Sallallahu Alyhi wa Sallam). The Holy Prophet (Sallallahu Alyhi wa Sallam) told him to repeat his Salaah again. After repeating his Salaah three times the Holy Prophet (Sallallahu Alyhi wa Sallam) told him to complete every position of Salaah correctly by making sure that he keeps still before going into the next position.

The following are the different positions of Salaah and what we should read in them:

#### 1. Qiyaam - to stand

To begin the Salaah by reading the Takbeer:



Allah is the Greatest

#### 2. Rukoo - to bow

To read the Tasbeeh in Ruku:


# Fresh Start (Taubah)



#### To make a fresh start (Taubah)

It is very good now that you want to spend your life following Allah and the ways of the Holy Prophet (Sallallahu Alayhi wa Sallam). However in the past if you have not followed Allah, His Prophet (Sallallahu Alayhi wa Sallam), or done something wrong to the Creation of Allah e.g. friends and family, then you must start to make things better and ask for forgiveness otherwise you will not be able to reach the Palace of the Pleasure of Allah.

Have you ever used a slate or magnetic drawing board for drawing pictures. Sometimes you start to draw and half-way through you feel it is not good or you have made a mess out of it. All you do is to flip it or wipe the slate clean. Then you can start all over again. That is what Allah does when we accept and ask forgiveness from the mistakes we have made and we feel we have made a bad picture with our deeds.



#### The four steps to make a fresh start

There are four steps you need to follow in order to make a fresh start all over again. The example of the steps is like, if you do not properly use the wipe or wiping button to clean, the board will not become clean. So you must properly ask forgiveness with the steps mentioned below:

1) To feel sorry and shameful.

2) To stop doing the bad act and leave the things and bad friends who lead to that act like evil/bad things TV, Internet and games etc.

3) Plan not to do the bad action in future.

4) If you have missed prayers, or stolen anything or hurt anyone you have to say sorry and return their thing.

It is important that you must complete the steps written above and must remember that you must plan not to do the bad action in the future. Remember not to make a promise just in case you do the bad action again in which case you can just return to the four steps written above in order to change. If you are not able to leave the bad action then in such a case you shouldn't stop trying to change because Allah loves those who keep turning towards Him. Only the Prophets (Upon them be peace) and Angels never do any bad things.

So if you want to make a real fresh start then you need to make sure from now on you start to give everyone their right. Otherwise you will need to make a fresh start again by following the four steps that were mentioned on the last page.

Written underneath and the next few pages are the rights of Allah and the rest of Creation.

#### The rights of Allah

- 1. As Allah Created you alone, you owe it to him that you worship Him alone and not to worship other Gods apart from him.
- 2. To worship Allah only to please Him and not to show off to others.
- 3. To pray your Salaah and if you have missed any prayers you need to try and pray them. (This is when you get a bit more older).
- 4. To fast in Ramadhan and if you have missed any fasts in Ramadhan then you need to keep them as soon as you can. (This is when you get a bit more older).

- 1. To have a complete and perfect belief in the Holy Prophet (Sallallahu Alayhi wa Sallam).




Before you begin the journey to the Land of Purification, You must complete this book by learning the THREE GOLDEN PRINCIPLES of trying hard and making effort. They are:

Then they asked Allah for help. They prayed:


Our Rabb! Pour down upon us patience, and make our feet firm, and help us against the disbelieving people. (2:250).







### Lesson 1 - Arabic words

Our religion (Deen) is based on the law of Allah, The Great. The law of Allah is understood from the Holy Qur'aan and from the teachings of the Holy Prophet (Sallallahu Alyhi wa Sallam). The teachings of the Prophet (Sallallahu Alyhi wa Sallam) are known as the Sunnah. The People that have studied Islam (Scholars) have placed the laws of our religion into different categories, to help us understand and practice our religion. The following Arabic terms will help us understand which acts you have to do, which acts are not allowed, which are recommended and which acts are disliked by Allah.

- 1. Fardh or Waajib These actions are compulsory and must be done by the Muslim, such as the five daily prayers. Doing the Fardh counts as a good deed, and not doing it is considered a bad deed or a sin.
- 2. Sunnah These are the actions which the Holy Prophet (Sallallahu Alyhi wa Sallam) did or approved. Leaving out a Sunnah act will decrease the reward and beauty of the action, even though it will be accepted. If we follow the Sunnah of the Holy Prophet (Sallallahu Alyhi wa Sallam) we earn the love of Allah and His Prophet (Sallallahu Alyhi wa Sallam). We should therefore not leave out a Sunnah without a good reason.
- 3. Mustahab These actions are recommended for the Muslim to do as there is a great reward in it. Not doing it does not count as a bad deed or a sin.
- 4. Haraam These actions are not allowed for the Muslim to do such as stealing and lying. Doing the Haram counts as a bad deed and not doing it counts as a good deed.
- 5. Makrooh These actions are not liked by Allah, such as growing very long fingernails or sleeping on the stomach. Not doing the Makrooh counts as a good deed and doing it does not count as a bad deed.

### Lesson 2 - Taking a bath (Ghusl)

Ghusl is a special method of washing the entire body to become clean from any dirt. Ghusl is only complete if every part of our body is wet. A clean body is loved by Allah and protects us from germs and sickness. Water is a gift from Allah; we must not waste it when making Ghusl.

### Fardh acts of Ghusl

There are three Fardh acts of Wudhu. They are:

- 1. To rinse the mouth with water. Make sure water goes to the top of the throat when gargling. However if you are fasting then you should not gargle the water to the top of the throat just incase it goes inside the mouth.
- 2. To rinse the nose (make sure the water reaches the hard part of the nose).
- 3. To wash the entire body once. Make sure no part of the body is left dry. Especially inside the belly button and inside the ears.

### Practical Ghusl

- 1. Make Niyyah intention.
- 2. Wash both hands upto the wrists.
- 3. Wash the private parts.
- 4. Make Wudhu. If one is making Wudhu in such a place where the water gathers around the feet, then the feet should be washed at the end of Ghusl.
- 5. Pour water over the head three times.
- 6. Pour water over the right shoulder three times, then left three times.
- 8. Rub the body well each time so that not a single hair remains dry.

## Lesson 3 - Wudhu (Ablution)

Wudhu is a special way of cleaning ourselves taught to us by Allah The Most Kind. The key to Salaah is Wudhu. Just as a broken key cannot open a door, an incorrect Wudhu will not open the door to Salaah. (i.e. Salaah will not be accepted).

#### Conditions for doing Wudhu properly

There are two conditions at the beginning of Wudhu to make sure that it is performed properly:

- 1. That Pure and clean water reaches all those parts of the body which are Fardh to wash.
- 2. To make sure that there is nothing on the body that stops water from reaching the body such nail polish, paint, wax, etc.

#### The actions that MUST be done (Fardh) in Wudhu:

There are four acts, which are Fardh in Wudhu. If any one of these four are left out or left unfinished, Wudhu will be incomplete. Allah does not accept Salaah with incomplete Wudhu.

- 1. To wash the full face from the hairline of the forehead to below the chin and from one earlobe to the other earlobe once.
- 2. To wash both arms including the elbows once.
- 3. To make Masah: To wipe with wet hands over one quarter of the head once.
- 4. To wash both feet including the ankles once.

## Lesson 5 - When is Wudhu necessary

Wudhu is a special way of cleaning ourselves before performing certain acts of worship. Wudhu cleans our body and cleans us from sins. It makes us worthy of performing certain acts of worship. The Holy Prophet (SallAllaho alyhi wa Salam) has said: "The key to Jannah is Salaah, and the key to Salaah is purity.

Wudhu is necessary for the following four things:

- 1. We read Salaah
- 2. We touch or hold the Qur'aan
- 3. We make Sajdah-tilaawah
- 4. We make Tawaaf of the Ka'bah

### Lesson 6 - Seven Conditions of Salaah

Salaah is the most important act of worship in Islaam. It is the first duty of a Muslim, after believing in Allah and the Messenger (Sallallahu Alyhi wa Sallam). We read Salaah five times a day. Allah only accepts Salaah if we complete seven conditions. If any one of these seven conditions are missing, our Salaah will not be complete.

- 1. Our clothes must be clean.
- 2. Our Body must be clean.
- 3. The place of Salaah must be clean. You should find a clean place to make your Salaah. A prayer rug is not necessary. A prayer rug is always kept clean, and ensures a clean place when you are praying on it.
- 4. Our body must be covered. For boys, the cloth should cover at least from the belly button to the knees. For girls, the cloth should cover from the neck to the ankle, and to the wrist. The head is covered, while the face can remain uncovered.
- 5. The time for Salaah must be correct. Fardh (obligatory) prayers are performed at the proper and correct time. It is better to perform the prayer as soon as the Adhaan (call to prayer) is announced.
- 6. We must face the Qiblah which is the direction of Ka'bah in Makkah.
- 7. We must make intention (Niyyah) for Salaah.

## Lesson 7 - Obligatory (Fardh) acts of Salaah

There are different actions we HAVE to do in Salaah. If any one of these actions are left out Salaah will not be accepted. Sometimes we lift our hands when beginning Salaah but forget to say the "Takbeer-Tahreemah" which is a Fardh of Salaah. This will make our Salaah incorrect.

There are six Fardh acts in Salaah:

- 1. Takbeer Tahreemah To say Allaho Akbar.
- 2. Qiyaam To stand upright.
- 3. Qiraa'ah To recite at least three short Aayahs (verses) or one long Aayah (verse) of the Qur'aan.
- 4. Rukoo To bow down.
- 5. Sajdah To prostrate. There are two Sajdahs (Prostrations) in a Raka'ah (unit). In prostration both palms of the hand, the forehead, the tip of the nose, the knees and the toes touch the ground.
- 6. Qadah Akheerah To sit at the end of the last Raka'ah (unit) for as long as it takes to read the Tashahhud.

## Lesson 8 - How to read two Rakaah Salaah according to the way of the Prophet (Sallallahu Alyhi wa Sallam)

#### Before Salaah

- 1. Make sure that you have Wudhu and your clothes are clean.
- 2. Stand respectfully on a clean place facing the Qiblah.
- 3. Keep both feet straight and parallel, at least four fingers apart, with toes pointing towards the Qiblah.
- 4. Be aware that you are about to speak to Allah.
- 5. Make Intention (Niyyah) of whichever Salaah you are about to pray.

#### Example

- · I am about to perform two Rak'aahs of Fardh Salaah of Fajr (to please Allah) facing towards the Qiblah.
- When you are praying Salaah behind an Imaam, you should also make intention that:
- · I am following this Imaan.
- · You can make intention in the heart but it is better if you make it with the tongue. The intention can be made in any language.

#### 1. TAKBEER-E-TAHREEMAH

After making the intention, lift the two hands up to the earlobes in such a manner that both palms face towards the Qiblah and read the following:

Allah is the Greatest

Girls should only lift their hands up to the shoulders and be careful that only their hands are showing (not arms).

2. Next fold the hands below the belly button. Place the hands in such a way that the palm of the right hand is placed over the back of the left hand, with the right thumb and little finger gripping the wrist of the left hand and the three middle fingers of the right hand kept straight and together. While in standing position (Qiyaam) the eyes should be fixed to the spot where the forehead will rest in Sajdah.

Girls place arms on the chest NOT BELOW BELLY BUTTON. Also they place the right hand over the back of the left hand and do not hold it like the boys.



3. Now read the following Dua:

#### 4. Next read:


After that read Surah Faatiha and then any short surah.

5. Next bow down (Ruku) and read the following at least three or five times:

Glory be to my Lord, The Great

#### Boys


- In Rukoo hold both the knees with the fingers apart.
- Ensure that the arms do not touch the body.
- Keep the back straight, while the head should neither be lowered nor raised.




#### Girls

- When making Rukoo, girls should only bend over enough so that their hands reach their knees only.
- The hands should be placed on the knees, with the fingers kept together.
- In Rukoo the elbows should touch the sides of the body and the feet kept together.

6. To stand up after Rukoo (Qawmah). Whilst coming up read the following:






Then when you are in a standing position to say the Dua':

#### 7. First Sajdah (Bowing down)

Now saying Allahu Akbar and placing both hands on the knees go into Sajdah. (On completing the Takbeer you should have reached the position of Sajdah). When going into Sajdah first place the Knees on the ground, then the hands, then the nose and then the forehead. The face should rest between the two hands with fingers pointing towards the Qiblah. When in Sajdah the feet should be upright with the toes pointing towards the Qiblah. The arms should not touch the sides of the body nor the ground. The stomach should be away from the thighs.

In Sajdah recite softly at least THREE or FIVE times the following:





#### Girls

In Sajdah the upper part of the leg (the thigh) should not be upright but in as flat a position as possible, with the feet spread towards the right.

- · While in Sajdah the stomach and thighs must be kept together.
- · The forearms should be put flat on the ground in Sajdah. Girls must not raise their voice when reading the Dua'.

#### 8. Jalsa (To sit up between two Sajdahs)

Saying Allahu Akbar sit up straight, do not sit with the back crooked or stooped. It is important to sit up and pause after the first Sajdah, merely lifting the head from the ground without sitting up before the second Sajdah will nullify the Salaah.



#### 9. Second Sajdah

Saying Allah hu Akbar stand up for the second Qiyaam. On getting up from the Sajdah first lift the forehead, then the nose and then the knees. Ensure that the hands are on the knees and not on the ground for support, except for a valid reason. Saying Bismillahir-rahmanir-rahim recite Surah Al-Fatiha and a Surah and complete the second Rak'aah in the same way as the first one.

#### 10. Final Sitting (Qai'dah)

After completing the Second Sajdah of the second Rak'aah saying Allahu Akbar sit up for Qai'dah.

The method of sitting is placing the Left foot flat on the ground and sitting on it, with the Right foot upright and its toes facing towards the Qiblah. The hands must be placed on the thighs with the tips of the fingers near the knees. It is important that the fingers are kept close together and that they face the Qiblah and not towards the ground. The eyes should be fixed on the lap.

On reaching the Kalimah form a circle with the thumb and middle finger and lift the index finger of the right hand and at Illallahu drop it onto the thigh. The circle should be kept to the end.



Note: If you are performing a four Raka'ah Salaah after step e. rather than sitting down you stand up and start from step c. all the way to f. again.

## Fasting (Sawm)

Fasting in the month of Ramadhan is the most important obligation after prayer. It is the third Pillar of Islam. The simple meaning of fasting means to stay away from eating or drinking. When Muslims fast, they do not eat or drink from dawn to sunset.

These fasts are Fardh (Compulsory) for every, sane, adult, healthy Muslim. They are not compulsory for young children. If healthy children do not experience any problems while fasting, they should also keep the fasts. This will help them to fast when they become older.


It is a major sin to miss the fasts of Ramadhan without any valid reason or genuine excuse.

#### Compulsory (Fardh) acts of Fasting

- 1. Intention it can be said with the tongue or in the heart, however saying with the tongue is better. The wordings are 'Oh Allah I intend to do a Fardh fast today only for your happiness'. The intention can be made at night till Sehri time ends for fasts in Ramadhan.
- 2. Not to eat and drink from dawn to sunset.

## Zakaah (Purification of wealth)

Zakaah is the fourth pillar of Islam. It is a type of charity, by which the poor people are helped.

To pay the Zakaah is Fardh (Obligatory) upon a rich Muslim. Paying the Zakaah is the command of Allah. The person who does not believe that they have to give Zakaah is a disbeliever.

Zakaah is paid once a year. It is given to the poor, helpless and needy people.

If any rich person has poor brothers and sisters, then to pay Zakaah to them is much better.

Allah puts blessing in the wealth of a person who pays the Zakaah and the poor person taking the Zakaah prays for the person.

By helping the poor and needy Allah becomes very happy.

Those people who do not pay the Zakaah, no blessings fall upon their houses and they remain sad and worried.

The person who does not believe in Hajj is a disbeliever.


Performing the Hajj is obligatory (Fardh) only once in a lifetime.

## Honesty

Honesty has many different meanings. One meaning is that we are true to others and also ourselves. We are honest if we admit our mistakes. We can show honesty in two ways: a) things that we say, and b) things that we do.

We do not hide or steal things even if nobody is watching us. Even if nobody watches us, Allah (Subhaanahu wa Ta'Aala) always sees what we do. Allah (Subhaanahu wa Ta'Aala) loves an honest person.

Honesty also means that we keep our word. When we say something that we will do or not, we should keep our words.

When people are honest, we know we can trust them. Prophet Muhammad (Sallallahu Alayhi wa Sallam) was known as Al-Amin, the Trustworthy one. People believed him, because he never lied. We should learn from the example of our Prophet (Sallallahu Alayhi wa Sallam). Honesty means that you can be trusted.

Honesty also means that we respect other's property. If something is not mine, I cannot take it secretly.


Honesty is not to cheat, even if nobody is watching us, we should remember Allah (Subhaanahu wa Ta'Aala) watches us.







This will help you very much and will give you the energy you need to keep you going on your journey. Without it you will not be able to reach your destination.



# Remembrance



#### La ilaha ilallah

In order to reach Allah there is also something very important you need to do every day. That is the Dhikr; La ilaaha ill Allah. By doing this you will get spiritual energy and strength to travel the journey.

Without it you will find it very hard to travel the journey and reach Allah.

Doing Dhikr is like a person in a computer game who picks up a potion from the floor to give him energy when it gets less.

Or like when your dad puts petrol in the car and when it gets low on fuel.

However the main purpose of the Dhikr is to cleanse you from all the evil desire that are within you.







## The way to do the Remembrance of Allah

#### What to think before beginning the remembrance

Before you begin, you need to make a connection with Allah the High, otherwise the benefit from the Dhikr will be less. Just like the telephone wire that is not plugged into the socket or when there is no network for your mobile, it is not possible to talk with anyone, even though you may have the best mobile or you speak in a very loud voice.

#### How to start a Connection

Before beginning the remembrance you should try to bring the following three keys in your heart and mind and to hold these throughout the Dhikr:

- 1) Allah is watching me
- 2) Allah is with me
- 3) Allah is listening to my Dhikr

## Before beginning the remembrance of Allah you should recite the words below while keeping the meaning in mind:

- 1) Bismillah In the Name of Allah (Once)
- 2) Astaghfirullah Oh Allah I seek your forgiveness (three times)
- 3) Prayers for the Prophet (Allah Humma Salle 'Alaa Muhammadin Wa 'Alaa aali Muhammadin) Oh Allah send your Peace and Blessings upon The Prophet Muhammad and upon His Family (three times).
- 4) La hawla wa la quwwata illa billah There is no might nor power except in Allah.

#### What to say during the Remembrance



### What to think in the Mind during the Remembrance

Firstly you should start off by thinking that the place of the Nafs (evil desires) is at the stomach (the Nafs is the place from which all the evil wants come from such as love of bad things, evil thoughts and bad qualities). You should purify and clean the heart and Nafs from the darkness and rust which have made them dirty because of the bads deeds.

### How to do the Remembrance

Whilst reading the Laa you should first look towards your stomach. You should think that the place of the Nafs is at the stomach where all the evil desires come from. You should then pull your head upwards until it becomes level and think that you are pulling upwards all the darkness and dirt from the sins that are in the stomach.



2 Ilaaha – which means True God (worthy of worship), when you say this word you should imagine in the mind as though you are saying "all the things that make me forgetful of Allah the High are not gods, so why should I follow them and listen to them." With this thought you should imagine that you have taken them out of your mind and that you are giving up all of these desires for Allah.






After that you should imagine and think that my God is Allah, The one Who has the power to give me life and death, benefit and harm, honour and disgrace, paradise and hell, and to increase or decrease things. I will only worship Him and live my life according to His commands. You should think this with your heart and mind.





4 IIAllah - Which means except Allah. When you say this you should point your head in the direction of the heart imagining that above you is the name of Allah. When you say IIAllah imagine the light of the name of Allah is making your heart shine. You should also think and imagine that in my heart there is no true God Except Allah. This will complete one cycle.




Thereafter you should carry on by going back to your stomach as you first started and repeating the process. Continue like this untill you complete the length of time that was given to you (e.g. 10 minutes). Towards the end ask forgiveness from Allah, the High as you have not been able to remember Him as He deserved to be remembered and pray that He benefits you from the remembrance.

## Talking to Allah from the heart (Muraaqabah)

To help you in your journey to the Palace of the Pleasure of Allah, you should also talk with your Lord, Allah, the All knowing through the tongue of the heart. In other words you should fix a time every day in which you talk to Allah from the heart and mind.

# Warning - Disturbing thoughts:

When you will remember your Lord, Allah, obviously the Satan's jealousy and hatred will increase. So Satan will do whatever is within his power to distract and disturb you. Satan has the power to whisper thoughts in the mind and heart. As long as you do not bring thoughts of anything other than Allah by yourself or do not think about the whispers of Satan, the thoughts do not harm you. Rather you can get more closer to Allah, by rejecting the thoughts and returning to the remembrance of Allah, the High. Try not to fight with the different thoughts. Just ignore and carry on with your task. So remember Do NOT bring any evil thoughts or fight them, JUST IGNORE THEM.










## The way to do the Muraaqabah

Before beginning the Muraaqabah make the connection with Allah as was mentioned previously and again you should recite the words below while keeping their meaning in mind:

- 1) Bismillah In the Name of Allah (Once)
- 2) Astaghfirullah Oh Allah I ask your forgiveness (three times)
- 3) Prayers for the Prophet (Allah Humma Salle 'Alaa Muhammadin Wa 'Alaa aali Muhammadin) Oh Allah send your Peace and Blessings upon Prophet Muhammad and upon His Family (three times)

Now Look at the name of Allah for about 20 seconds, then close your eyes and try to see the name of Allah with the power of your imagination. Open your eyes after 30 seconds again and look at the blessed name of Allah. Do this three times. If you do see the name of Allah the High when your eyes are closed then try to make the connection stronger by feeling that He is close to you. If you do not see the name of Allah, then don't worry about it.




## 2 What to think during the Muraaqabah

Now keep your eyes closed and start the Muraaqabah for ten minutes. Firstly you should try to imagine that from the name of Allah a bright light is coming and shining onto your heart and cleansing the darkness that has come onto it due to the bad things you have done.

You should also pray to Allah from the heart, mentioning your worries, difficulties or needs. You can even say to Him how much you love Him as well!! The Main purpose of this exercise is to build a strong and close connection and relationship with your Lord.

For example you can say to Allah in your heart 'Oh Allah You can do everything so please help me to pass my exam' or 'Oh Allah I am so sick please make me better'. Or even still 'Oh Allah help me to follow your beloved Messenger Muhammad (Sallallahu Alayhi wa Sallam) so that I can enter Heaven'.


This is what the heart looks like when a person is born before we spoil it with all the evil sins.




This is the effect on the heart when a person accepts Islam or when a person truly changes from his/her sins. It's very similar to the first heart, clean and free from any sin.




This is what the heart looks like when the person does not believe in Allah and His Beloved Messenger (Sallallahu Alayhi wa Sallam). It is pitch black




This is what the heart looks like when a person commits a sin. A black spot appears through one of the seven organs, which are represented by the seven pipes







# Sunnahs relating to eating

Humans and animals both have a common need to eat. However what makes us different from animals is our behaviour and manners while eating. The way to eat taught to us by the Holy Prophet (Sallallahu Alayhi wa Sallam) makes us different not only from animals but also different from non Muslims. As Muslims we do not stand and eat like animals, and we do not eat with our left hand like some non Muslims.

- 1. Wash the hands before and after eating.
- 2. Eat with the intention that you get energy and strength through the food to do good deeds.
- 3. Eat sitting on the floor in one of the positions:
- a. To sit on left leg having the other knee raised.
- b. To sit on both legs as in the Tashahhud position.
- c. To squat with the bum away from the ground.
- 4. Eat with the right hand.
- 5. Do not sniff the food nor blow into it.
- 6. Do not criticise the food.
- 7. Do not waste any food. Clean your plate and lick your fingers. If some food falls from the plate, pick it up, clean it and eat it.



# Sunnahs relating to drinking

Oh Allah thank you for giving us good and pure drinking water. We know there are so many children that have to walk long distances to get water for their families. We must learn not to waste water.

- 1. Drink with the right hand.
- 2. To sit and drink.
- 3. To look into the glass before drinking.

# Sunnahs relating to Clothing (for boys)

- 1. You should not wear Gold, silk clothing, or any clothes with pictures of humans or animals on them.
- 2. Always take off your clothes in privacy.
- When removing clothes remove the left limbs first. When putting on clothes start with the right limbs first.
- 4. Always wear clean clothes.
- 5. The clothing worn must be modest in colour and style. The Sunnah is to wear a long shirt and sleeves that reach up to the wrists. The collar and neckline should be towards the chest.
- 6. To sometimes wear a black Turban, sometimes white and sometimes green.
- 7. You must never allow your trousers to hang below the ankles.



# Sunnahs relating to Clothing (for girls)

- 1. You should not wear attractive clothing with really shiny and bright colours when you go outside,
- 2. Always take off your clothes in privacy.
- 3. When removing clothes remove the left limbs first. When putting on clothes start with the right limbs first.
- 4. Always wear clean clothes.
- 5. You should always wear loose clothing that does not reveal the shape of the body and to make sure you cover all parts of the body including the hair and head except face and hands i.e. by wearing a Hijaab and Jilbaab.
- 6. You should not wear any clothes with pictures of humans or animals on them.
- 7. You should not wear boys clothing.

# Masnoon Azkaars (Duas of the Holy Prophet (Sallallahu Alyhi wa Sallam)

The Holy Prophet (Sallallahu Alyhi wa Sallam) gave us a very important gift in order to protect us from all kinds of evil such as black magic, devils, jinn, and the evil eye. There are lots of evil people in the world and sometimes due to jealousy and hatred they may want to hurt you by doing black magic on you. These Duas have been taught to us by the Holy Prophet (Sallallahu Alyhi wa Sallam) free of charge in order to protect us.

You should read the prayers that are written below every morning at fajr time, anytime before sunrise and every evening after maghrib before isha. When you read them in the morning you are protected by a shield of light until the evening. And when you read them in the evening you are protected by a shield of light all the way till the morning.

## Sunnahs relating to Walking

- 1. To walk upright. Not with your chest out nor with your back bent.
- 2. To walk with long strides and lifting your feet. Do not walk while dragging your feet as this is the way of the arrogant people.
- 3. Remove any obstacle from the road or anything that is likely to cause an accident.
- 4. Do not walk ahead of your friends to display your position. Rather walk behind and never try to make your presence felt.
- 5. You should walk at a medium pace. Do not walk too fast as if you are jogging, or so slow as if you are ill.
- 6. You should not walk with one shoe or sandal.
- 7. You should walk with the your eyes lowered to the ground slightly, but be aware of your surroundings. Do not concern yourself with people's homes and what they are doing.

## Lesson 2 - To believe in Angels

Angels are a special creation of Allah. The Arabic word for Angels is 'Mala'ikah'. They always fulfill their duties. They are never disobedient to Allah. Angels do not eat or drink. They do not sleep nor do they get tired. They are neither female nor male. They have neither families nor children.

Angels were created long before the creation of Prophet Adam (Alayhi salam). They can take different shapes and forms. Sometimes they take the form of very handsome men. Angels have huge wings. Some have two wings, some three; some four and some others have many, many more. Allah has created millions and millions of angels. No one knows their exact number. They occupy the heavens and the earth and every other world Allah has created.

## The four main Angels

Jibra'il (Alayhi salam) is the Angel of Revelation of Divine Holy Books (Wahi). He brings the laws and books of Allah to the Prophets (Peace and Blessings be upon them all). Sometimes he is sent by Allah to punish those who are disobedient.

Malakul Maut also known as Izra'iI (Alayhi salam) is the Angel of death. He takes the souls of people out of their bodies at the time of death. He is the first angel that we will see. He is a comfort to the believers and gives them the good news of Heaven. But he is terrifying to the disbelievers and is merciless and very harsh towards them.

The Angel Israfil (Alayhi salam) has been given the task of blowing the Soor, the heavenly trumpet, which will cause the universe and all of creation to be destroyed. Thereafter Allah will command him to blow the trumpet a second time. All human beings will come back to life and the Day of Final Decision will then begin.

Mika'il (Alayhi salam) is the Angel appointed to bring the rain and cause the plants, trees and fruit to grow. He is also in charge of the weather and the provisions for men and animals.

## Other Angels apart from the main four

Ridwan (Alayhi salam) is the keeper of Jannah. He is a most beautiful and majestic angel.

Malik (Alayhi salam) is a terrifying angel who is the guardian of Hellfire. He has no compassion or mercy and his duty is to punish the wrongdoers in hell.

Two angels named Munkar (Alayhi salam) and Nakir (Alayhi salam) will question the dead in the grave.

Every person is accompanied by another two angels, Kiraman (Alayhi salam) and Katibin (Alayhi salam), one who sits on the right shoulder and the other on the left. The angel on the right writes whatever good we do. The angel on the left writes whatever bad we do.

Mulhim (Alayhi salam) is the name of an angel who accompanies every Mu'min, and encourages him to do good deeds.

There are angels who protect people from disasters and accidents.

70,000 Angels descend to the Green Dome every morning and evening. They send Peace and Blessings upon the Holy Prophet (Sallallahu Alayhi wa Sallam) and it will continue until the Day of Final Decision.

An angel is appointed on the Green Dome, who has been given power to hear people send peace and blessings upon the Holy Prophet (Sallallahu Alayhi wa Sallam) from far.

There are angels who carry the throne of Allah and continually praise and glorify Him.

## Lesson 3 -To believe in the Books of Allah

All Muslims believe that Allah has sent His guidance (instructions) to His Prophets (Peace be upon them all) in the form of books.

These books were sent as revelation through the angel, Jibra'il (Alayhi salam) and contained the very words of Allah.

Muslims believe in these books and respect them.

All these books taught the very same message, the message of Islam, the message of submission and obedience to Allah.

Allah has sent many books to earth with His Prophets (Peace be upon them all). The Prophets (Peace be upon them all) taught the people the message of Islam revealed in these books.

The Prophets (Peace be upon them upon all) guided the people with these books.

After they left the world, the people would still read the book they brought and take lessons from them. But as time passed many of these books were forgotten and lost and many more were changed by evil, greedy men.

Many incorrect beliefs and ideas were added to these books. Many of the commands of Allah that evil men disliked were removed from these books.

It is now very hard to say what the original message of Allah was in these books. All the books of Allah have been changed by evil, greedy, bad people throughout time, except the Qur'an. In the Qur'aan, Allah tells us about some of the books He revealed to previous Prophets (Peace and Blessing be upon them).

The Suhuf (Scrolls) were revealed to Prophet Ibrahim (Alayhi salam).

The Tawrah (Torah) was revealed to Prophet Musa (Alayhi salam).

The Zabur (Psalms) was revealed to Prophet Dawud (Alayhi salam).

The Injil (Evangel or Bible) was revealed to Prophet 'Isa (Alayhi salam).

The Qur'an, was revealed to Prophet Muhammad (Sallallahu Alayhi wa Sallam).

The Suhuf of Prophet Ibrahim (Alayhi salam) were lost and nobody knows where they are.

The Tawrah of Prophet Musa (Alayhi salam) was changed by the Jewish rabbis because of greed, pride and not believing in Allah.

The 'Injil of Prophet 'Isa (Alayhi salam) was changed by the Christian priests because of ignorance, foolishness and evil wishes.

The Qur'aan is the only book of Allah which has not been changed.

The Qur'aan was revealed in the ancient Arabic language, the language of the Prophets and the angels.

It is still recited in its original language, just as it was revealed.

The Qur'aqn was also revealed to correct the changes made in the previous books.

No new book will be revealed after the Qur'aan.

## Lesson 4 - To believe in Allah's Messengers and Prophets (Peace be upon them all)

All Muslims believe in the many Prophets and messengers Allah has sent to guide people.

They all gave the same basic teaching that human beings should worship God, and God alone, and do good to his fellow-beings. Of course, the details of the teachings were different according to the people and the time in which a Prophet appeared.

In the Holy Quran, the teachings of all Prophets are called Islam, and the Prophets and their true followers are known as Muslims.

Every nation was sent a Prophet. About 124,000 Prophets were sent altogether.

All the prophets were human beings. They were all men, none of them were women.

Only Allah chooses a person to be a Prophet. No one can become a Prophet on his own. No one can equal them. They were the best of all people.

They don't commit any sins, both Major and Minor. By this they became models for their people. No person can become a Prophet or Messenger by His own effort.

Twenty-five Prophets and Messengers were mentioned in the Quran. They are: Aadam, the father of all mankind and the first of all the Prophets, Idrees, Nooh, Hood, Saalih, Ibraaheem, Luot, Shu`ayb, Ismaa'eel, Is-Haaq, Ya'qoob, Yoosuf, Ayyoob, Elyasa', Thul-Kifl, Elyaas, Yoonus, Moosaa, Haaroon, Daawood, Sulaymaan, Zakariyyaa, Yahyaa, 'Isa, and Muhammad (Peace and Blessings be upon them all).

To be respectful to them all is necessary and to disrespect any of them makes one a disbeliever.

He (Sallallahu Alayhi wa Sallam) split the moon into two, sometimes trees greeted him and animals spoke to him. Allah granted Him the most number of miracles.

He was the kindest, most generous and most concerned of all human beings. He had the best character of all.

He (Sallallahu Alayhi wa Sallam) alone saw Allah in the night of Miraaj.

He will be the first to rise from his grave on the Day of Final Decision and He will be the first to intercede on the Day of Final Decision

He (Sallallahu Alayhi wa Sallam) will be elevated to a Glorious Station (Magaam-al-Mahmood) on the Day of Final Decision. All of humanity will praise Him.

He was the cause of our guidance and salvation and so for this reason a Muslim should love and respect Him more than everyone else in the universe.

The Last Day starts when Allah orders one of the angels to blow the trumpet for the first time. Upon this, the earth will quake, the heavens will split apart, the stars will scatter, the mountains will vanish, and all the people will die.

Then Allah will order the angel to blow a second time and the dead will be brought back to life. They will be raised from their graves and they will be alive just like they were in this world.

Allah Says (what means): {Then it will be blown a second time and behold, they will be standing, looking on (waiting).} [Quran 39: 68]

Thus, all people will be awakened from their graves and because of their vast number, they will appear just like insects spread around everywhere.

The Qur'aan says, "They will ask about the Last Hour: "When will it take place?" Say, "Verily my Rabb alone has knowledge about it. None but He will reveal it at its time." (7:187)



The approach of the Last Day will be known by its signs shown to us by our Beloved Prophet Muhammad (Sallallahu Alayhi wa Sallam)

### Some of the minor signs

- 1. People will go against their Parents and disrespect them.
- 2. Telling lies and breaking promises will become common.
- 3. Singing, music and dancing will become common.
- 4. Alcohol and drugs will become common.
- 5. Undeserving people will become leaders.
- 6. There will much bloodshed and violence.
- 7. People will not care about Halaal and Haraam.

## Some of the major signs

- 1. When Muslims will be at their weakest, a leader will emerge who will lead the Muslims to victory. He will be known as the Mahdee.
- 2. Dajjal will then appear. He will claim to have the powers of Allah and many ignorant people will lose their Imaan by following him.
- 3. Prophet 'Isa (Alayhi salam) will then descend from the heavens and lead an army against Dajjal. He will kill Dajjal, and thereafter there will be peace. When 'Isa (Alayhi salam) will come He will not come with a new law but will follow the Qur'aan and Way of the Holy Prophet (Sallallahu Alayhi wa Sallam).
- 4. A very evil group of people known as Yajooj and Majooj will then spread across the entire world, causing harm and destruction.

  Allah will finally destroy them.
- 5. After all the major signs pass, the trumpet will be blown and the Day of Final Decision will begin.

## Lesson 7 To believe in Allah's knowledge and Will

We believe that Allah knows everything that has happened is happening and is going to happen and is happening by His will. Everything big and small has come into existence with Allah's will and power.

The sun, the moon, people, animals, plants, rain, winds, and all other creatures move and work according to His Knowledge and Will.

We also believe that Allah knows everything that will happen before He made everything. However, human beings, not being aware of the future, act with free will - not being forced to do anything.

In other words Allah has given human beings power over certain things but over other things we are powerless. As an example we have been given power to choose to pray our Salaah. However we don't have power to live forever.

Allah has only ordered us to do those things which are in our power, e.g. praying Salaah, fasting, obeying your parents.

This is the reason when someone commits a sin out of his own will, he will be punished and when he does something good he will be rewarded.

Someone once asked Hadhrat Ali (Radhi Allaho anho), "Are we completely free to do whatever we want or are we forced to do as Allah wills?"

He replied, "Raise one of your feet."

He did so.

Then Ali (Radhi Allaho anho) said, "Now raise your other foot."

He replied, "I cannot raise my other foot without resting the first one on the ground."

So Ali (Radhi Allaho anho) said to him, "Just understand from this how much you can do of your will and what you are powerless to do."

## Lesson 8 -To believe in the Life Hereafter

All Muslims believe that there is a life after death which will last forever. Allah says in the Qur'aan, "On that Day when mankind will come forward, cut from one another so that they may be shown their deeds".

When a person dies he will continue to live a life in the grave before the Day of Final Decision. Many things take place in this new "world", such as the "trial" of the grave, where everyone will be questioned by Angels about their religion, prophet, and Lord.

The grave is a garden of paradise or a pit of hell depending on the Person's actions; Angels of mercy visit the souls of believers and angels of punishment come for the unbelievers.

After that people will be brought back to life into their original physical bodies from their graves, then they will enter the final phase of life.

The Horn will blow again upon which people will rise up from their graves, and go to the land of Arafat waiting for the Day of Final Decision!

There will be so much fear that people will not recognise their own parents and family.

People will run from Prophet to Prophet, pleading with them to request Allah to begin the Judgment. All these Prophets will refuse apart from the Holy Prophet Muhammad (Sallallahu Alayhi wa Sallam).

The sun will be a mile above the heads of the people and they will be drowning in their own sweat.

On the Day of Final decision there will be no trees, no buildings and no shade of any type. The only shade on that day will be that of the throne of Allah. Nobody will be allowed to sit in that shade except those whom Allah allows.

Some of the fortunate people who will be allowed to sit in the special shade of Allah's throne will be those people who loved each other only for the pleasure of Allah; those who cried out of fear for Allah; those people used to worship a lot in the Masjid; and those people who followed the Sunnah all their lives. They will have no fear or worries and will be treated with honour and respect.

The Prophet (Sallallahu Alayhi wa Sallam) will make Dua to Allah to start the Judgement and His Dua will be accepted.

A huge scale, called the Mizaan will be set up to weigh the actions of people. Those whose good actions are heavier will be successful and those whose bad actions are heavier will be thrown into the Hellfire.

The book of actions will be given to the good people in their right hands. This means that they are successful.

The bad people will receive their books in their left hands, which means that they are unsuccessful.

The Prophet (Sallallahu Alayhi wa Sallam) will give His people water to drink from the pond of Kauthar. The Water of this pond is sweeter than honey and whiter than milk.

People will then cross the Bridge of Siraat. This bridge, spans across Hell and is sharper than a sword and thinner than a hair.

The Muslims will be guided across the bridge by the light (Noor) of their faith (Imaan). Those who performed the five Salaah on time will cross it with the speed of lightning.

The people of Hell will be made to drink boiling water and pus. They will eat thorny plants. Huge scorpions and poisonous snakes will attack them, while the angels will whip them.


Hell has been prepared for those who disbelieved and disobeyed Allah.

## Lesson 1 - The Sunnah way of making Ghusl

Allah says in the Qur'an: "If you are impure clean yourselves thoroughly" (Make Ghusl).

It is narrated by the Mother of the believers Sayyida 'Aisha (May Allah be pleased with her) that when the Holy Prophet (SallAllaho alyhi wa Salam) would begin by washing both hands and do Istinjaa', then he would do Wudhu like the Wudhu for Salaah. He would then wet his fingers and run them through the roots of his hair, before pouring water on His head three times. Finally He would run water over his whole body.

The following is the Prophetic (Sunnah) Way of making Ghusl:

- 1. Make Intention Niyyah.
- 2. Wash both hands up to the wrists.
- Wash off any filth from the body.
- 4. Make Istinjaa.
- 5. To do Wudhu like Wudhu is done for Salaah, washing each part three times and performing Masah of the head; but washing the feet should be left until the end if he is standing in a place where the water collects around the feet.
- 6. After Wudhu pour water over the head three times.
- 7. Thereafter, pour water over the right shoulder three times.
- 8. Then the left shoulder three times.
- 9. To scrub the body well so that not a single hair remains dry.
- 10. You should complete the Ghusl by washing each part straight after the other and not letting one part dry before you wash the next.

## Lesson 2 - Wudhu

## The necessary (Waajib) actions of Wudhu

It is Waajib to wash the outside of a thick beard.

It is Waajib for the water to reach the skin of a thin beard.

If the nails are overgrown so that they cover any part of the fingertips, or if there is anything beneath the nails that is stopping the water such as flour, dough, then it is Waajib to wash beneath it. This does include dirt.

If it is painful to wash the wounds of the feet (such as cracked skin around the heal area), it is permissible to just pass water over any medication applied to the wounds.

### Actions that break the Wudhu

When Wudhu breaks, we are in a state of lesser impurity.

Acts that break Wudhu are:

- 1. Passing stool, urine, or wind.
- 2. The flowing of blood or pus from any part of the body.
- 3. Vomiting a mouthful.
- 4. When there is blood in the Saliva.
- 5. To laugh (loudly) while performing Salaah whilst being awake.
- 6. To faint or to become insane.
- 7. Being drunk or drugged up.
- 8. To sleep while lying down or resting against something.

## Lesson 3 - The Sunnah acts in wudhu

- 7. For someone who is not fasting, to be thorough in rinsing the mouth and nose.
- 8. To comb or run the fingers (Khilaal) through a thick beard with one handful of water from beneath.
- 9. To make Khilaal of the fingers and toes.
- 10. To wash each part three times.
- 11. To Pass wet hands (Masah) over the whole head once starting from the front of the head.
- 12. To make Masah of both the ears once (with the same water as the water for the Masah of the head.
- 13. To scrub the areas washed.
- 14. To make Wudhu in the correct order.
- 15. To wash each limb before the previous limb dries e.g. to wash the arms before the face dries.

Fardh Salaah The Word Fardh means something we must do. Each of the five daily Salaah are Fardh. As an example if you look at the chart Fair has 2 Fardh Rak'aah.

Waajib Prayer The Waajib prayer is necessary to do. It is very similar to a Fardh prayer. The Witr Prayer is an example of a Waajib Prayer.

Sunnah Mu'akkadah Is an action which the Holy Prophet (Sallallahu Alyhi wa Salam) Sallam did all the time and did not leave without a valid reason. If a person misses a Sunnah Mu'akkadah all the time he will get sin.

Sunnah Ghair Mu'akkadah is an action which the Holy Prophet (Sallallahu Alyhi wa Salam) did but sometimes left it without a valid reason. It is not good for a person to leave Sunnah Ghair Mu'akkadah all the time.

Nafl Salaah The word Nafl means a voluntary prayer. Voluntary means that you have the option to pray it or not.

### Lesson 5 - Necessary (Waajibaat) acts of Salaah

Waajibaat are those actions that are necessary to complete the Salaah. If we miss any one of these actions forgetfully, we can redo the mistake by doing Sajda Sahw (Sajdah done for mistakes made forgetfully). If we do not perform Sajda Sahw or if we miss a Waajib action knowingly, it is necessary to perform that Salaah all over again.

The way of making the SAJDAH SAHW is that in the last rakaat you should recite the At-tahiyyaat only and after that make Salaam towards the right only. After that make two sajdahs. You should then repeat the At-tahiyyaat and complete your Salaah as normal.

There are thirteen Waajibaat in Salaah:

- 1. To recite Surah Faatihah.
- 2. To recite at least three short verses (Aayahs) or one long verse (Aayah) after Surah Al-Faatihah in every rakaat of Sunnah or Nafl Salaah.
- 3. To recite atleast three short verses, or one long verse after Surah AlFaatihah in the first two Raka'ah of Sunnah or Nafl Salaah.
- 4. To perform every act calmly, without rushing it.
- 5. To keep the proper order in recitation (Qira'ah), Bowing (Ruku), and Sajdah (Prostration).
- 6. To recite the Qira'ah softly in the Fardh salaah of Dhuhr and Asr, and loudly in all other Fardh Salaahs, including Jumu'ah, Eid, Taraaweeh and Witr salaah in Ramadhan.
- 7. To stand up after Ruku.
- 8. To sit between the two Sajdahs (Jalsah).
- 9. To read Tashahhud in the two sittings (Qaadahs).
- 10. To sit for the Tashahhud after every two Raka'ahs in a three or four Raka'ah Salaah.
- 11. To end the Salaah by making Salaam.
- 12. To recite Dua-ul-Qunoot in Witr Salaah
- 13. To make six extra Takbeers in both the Eid Salaahs.

#### Lesson 6 - Salaat ul-Witr (Prayer of Witr)

Witr Salaah has three Raka'ahs. The first two Raka'ahs are like the normal two Raka'ahs (as in Fajr, Dhur, Asr, Maghrib or Isha) but after Tashahhud in the second Raka'ah, stand upright and recite Surah Al-Fatihah. Then recite some other verses from the Holy Qur'aan. At this stage you do not bow down for Rukoo yet, but raise your hands upto the ears saying 'Allahu Akbar' and then fold your hands. Then recite the following:

O Allah! We seek help from You. We seek Your forgiveness. We believe in You. We rely on You. We praise You in the best manner. We thank You and we are not ungrateful to You. We leave and cast off one who disobeys You. O Allah! We worship You and to You do we pray and prostrate and to You do we flee and we are quick in doing so, and we hope for Your mercy and fear Your punishment. Verily, Your punishment overtakes the unbelievers.

When the above Dua is said then bow down for Rukoo saying 'Allahu Akbar' and complete the Salaah just like in Maghrib.

#### Lesson 7 - Prophetic (Sunnah) acts of Salaah

Sunnah refers to such deeds, which were practiced by the Holy Prophet (Sallallahu Alayhi wa Sallam). Leaving out a Sunnah act will lessen the reward and beauty of our Salaah, though the Salaah will be accepted. If we follow the Sunnah of the Holy Prophet (Sallallahu Alayhi wa Sallam) we earn the love of Allah and His Prophet (Sallallahu Alayhi wa Sallam).

#### Sunnahs whilst standing (Qiyaaam):

- 1. BOYS should raise both hands up to the ears and keep the fingers of both hands open with the palms facing the Qiblah when making Takbeerut Tahreemah (Saying Allah ho Akbar). GIRLS should only lift their hands up to the shoulders and be careful that only their hands are showing (not arms).
- 2. BOYS fold hands below the belly button by placing the right wrist on the left hand. GIRLS place arms on the chest NOT BELOW BELLY BUTTON. Also they place the right hand over the back of the left hand and do not hold it like the boys.

#### Sunnahs of recitation (Qir'aah):

- 1. To recite the Takbeer while changing from one position to the other.
- 2. To recite Thana softly at the beginning of the first Raka'ah.
- 3. To recite Taawwuz (Aoothu Billahi minashai Ta nirajeem) at the beginning of the first Raka'ah.
- 4. To recite Tasmiyah (Bismillahir Rahmaanir Raheem) at the beginning of every Raka'ah.
- 5. To recite Surah Al-Faatiha only, in the third and fourth Raka'ah of Fardh salaah.
- 6. To say Aameen softly after the recitation of Surah Faatiha.

#### Sunnah's of Bowing (Ruku) and Prostration (Sujood):

1. BOYS should keep their back and the head at the same level when making Ruku. They should make sure that the arms do not touch the body.

GIRLS should only bend over enough so that their hands reach their knees only. In Rukoo the elbows should touch the sides of the body and the feet kept together.

- 2. To recite Tasbeeh when you are bowing (Ruku) and prostrating (Sujood) (three times).
- 3. For BOYS when going into Sajdah, they should keep their back straight and first place the knees onto the ground, followed by the hands, the nose and the forehead.

GIRLS however, right from the start, lower their chest and go for Sajdah (Without keeping their back straight).

#### Sunnahs of the sitting positions (Qa'dah and Jalsah):

1. For BOYS when In Qa'dah or Jalsah position, place the left foot on the ground horizontally. Sit on the left foot while keeping the right foot straight so that the toes of the right foot face towards the Qiblah. Place both hands on the thighs.

GIRLS when In Qa'dah or Jalsah position sit on the left hip. Slide both feet out to the right side and let the left foot rest on the right calf of the leg.

- 2. To raise the index finger while saying the Shahaadah in Tashahhud.
- 3. To recite Durood Ibraheem in the final sitting (Qa'dah Akheerah) after Tashahhud and to recite a Dua after Durood Ibraheem.
- 4. To turn the face when making Salaam, first to the right, then to the left.

#### Lesson 8 -Actions that Break (Mufsidaat) the Salaah

Salaah is a special way of communicating with Allah The Most High. It has to be carried out with strict rules and conditions. Some actions are not good and incorrect for a person who is in Salaah and will then make the Salaah to be broken and invalid. In this case the entire Salaah has to be repeated. The following are the actions which break Salaah:

- 1. To talk in Salaah even if it be a single word, knowingly or unknowingly.
- 2. To make a sound or to say "Ooh!" or "Aah", for example because of pain.
- 3. To give or reply to Salaam or by any other method, while in Salaah.

#### Lesson 9 - Sawm (Fasting)

Sawm, or fasting, is the third pillar of Islam. The Arabic word Sawm means staying away from something. When a Muslim keeps the Sawm, he stays away from food and drink and all other bad things such as, lying, stealing, and thinking bad thoughts from sunrise to sunset with the intention of pleasing Allah. Sawm is another way of worshipping Allah.

Sawm is not a new practice. Allah had commanded all people who had Prophets (Peace be upon them all) sent to them to fast too. Muslims fast during the month of Ramadhan, the tenth month of the Islamic calendar. It is necessary for all adult Muslims to fast in Ramadhan. Young children may fast too if they wish but it is not necessary upon them.

#### Things that break (Mufsidaat) the fast

- 1. To swallow anything (this includes food, drink, and any other object like pebbles, cotton) intentionally. If you eat or drink forgetfully then your fast does not break.
- 2. If water goes down your throat, accidentally, whilst gargling then your fast will be broken.
- Smoking cigarettes.
- 4. Taking medicine.
- 5. Eating something stuck in the teeth the size of a pea.
- 6. Vomiting a mouthful purposefully.
- 7. If you were eating thinking that it was still Sehri time but later on you found out that Sehri time had already finished.
- 8. If you opened the fast thinking that it was time to open the fast but later on found out that it was not opened.

## Lesson 10 - Zakaah (Purification of Wealth)

Zakaah is a compulsory charity which the rich must give to the poor and needy. Paying Zakaah means giving £2.50 from every £100 of savings to the poor Muslims once a year. It is an act of 'Ibadah, an act of worship, commanded by Allah. Muslims give Zakaah as an act of obedience to Allah and to gain Allah's favour and pleasure. Whoever is selfish and refuses to pay the Zakaah will be disobeying a command of Allah and will deserve severe punishment. Allah is the owner of all things. We and all our wealth belong to Allah. The wealth which Allah has given us must be used in a manner that pleases Him.

One way of correctly using His wealth is by giving Zakaah. The Arabic word Zakaah means: Purity and increase. Zakaah purifies the wealth of Muslims and increases the blessings of Allah. It removes whatever evil wealth may bring like pride, greed or selfishness.

It also purifies the heart of the person recieving it from envy, jealousy and hatred. Zakaah creates love, respect and well wishing between the rich and poor. It develops a feeling of concern for others and responsibility towards the community. By giving Zakaah we help those who are unable to help themselves like or phans, widows and the disabled people. Zakaah provides Muslims with the opportunity of sharing their wealth with the less fortunate. By caring for others and showing mercy to them Allah shows us special care and mercy. Zakaah helps Muslim communities to distribute its wealth fairly. It helps bring equality between the rich and poor. Zakaah brings Allah's special blessings and favours too. Zakaah increases our wealth. It brings a great reward in Jannah.

It protects our belongings and saves us from Allah's anger and His punishment. Zakaah protects us from the fire of Jahannum. Giving Zakaah is a sign of true belief. Zakaah separates the true Muslims from the hypocrites.

#### Lesson 11 - Hajj (Pilgrimage)

Hajj, or pilgrimage, is the fifth pillar of Islam.

Hajj is the journey to the Holy Ka'bah, the Sacred House of Allah, in Makkah for the purpose of worshipping Allah in a very special way.

Hajj is performed during the month of Dhul-Hijjah, the twelfth month of the Islamic calendar.

Allah commands that Hajj be performed once in a lifetime by those adults who can afford the journey to Makkah and are physically strong enough to do so. Children may perform the Hajj too if they wish but it is not necessary for them.

Hajj is not a new practice. Allah had commanded all his Prophets (Peace be upon them all) to perform Hajj to the sacred Ka'bah.

Hajj is a great form of worship ('Ibadah) for which Allah rewards tremendously.

Because of the great sacrifices and difficulties in performing the Hajj, Allah grants the Haji, the person performing Hajj, His greatest rewards.

The Holy prophet Muhammad (Sallallahu Alyhi wa Sallam) said, "The Hajj which is accepted by Allah has no less reward than Jannah (Paradise) itself."

Hajj is an act of worship which purifies man of all sins.

The Messenger of Allah (Sallallahu Alyhi wa Sallam), "Whoever performs Hajj for Allah's pleasure alone and does not do any evil or sin, then he will return as pure (and free of sin) as he was on the day his mother gave birth to him."

There are eleven basic steps in performing the Hajj. They are as follows:

- 1) Wearing the Ihram, the simple pieces of white cloth, before entering the area around Makkah (the Migat).
- 2) Circling the Ka'bah seven times. This is called Tawaf.
- 3) Walking quickly between the two hills of Safa and Marwah. This is called Sa'iy.
- 4) Spending the day on the plains of Arafat just outside the city of Makkah. This is called Wuquf.
- 5) Staying the night in a place nearby called Muzdalifah.
- 6) Thereafter moving to a small town called Mina. This is called Mabit.
- 7) Stoning the three pillars representing shaytan. This is called Ramy.
- 8) Sacrificing (slaughtering) an animal. This is called Dhabh.
- Shaving or shortening the hair of the head. This is called Halq or Tagsir.
- 10) Circling the Ka'bah seven times again. This is called Tawafuz-Ziyarah.
- 11) Circling the Ka'bah seven times, once more. This is called Tawaful-Wada'.

# Improving levels of Prayer (Salaah)

## PRAYER

is not asking. It is a longing of the soul. It is daily admission

of one's weakness.

It is better in prayer to have a heart, without words, than words without a heart.

#### **Improving levels of Prayer**

In order to reach Allah the High, you also need to slowly improve your level of prayer. The Prayer is like the Mi'raaj of the Believer. In the night of Mi'raaj the Holy Prophet (Sallallahu Alayhi wa Sallam) travelled through the seven Heavens and met Allah. Just like the Holy Prophet (Sallallahu Alayhi wa Sallam) travelled to Allah the High on the night of Mi'raaj, with His Blessed body, you too can travel with your spirit through the heavens by praying your Salaah more like the Prophet (Sallallahu Alayhi wa Sallam) did. You can perform the prayer at a number of levels which are never ending. There are two ways you can improve your prayer; physically and spiritually.



First of all you need to improve
the physical level of your Prayer. What I
mean by physical Prayer is how to pray
more and more closer to the way the Holy
Prophet (Sallallahu Alayhi wa Sallam) used to
pray. You will achieve this by practising the
knowledge of the different parts of the
Wudhu, Ghusl and Salaah that you learnt from
the Books of Do's and Don'ts.

What I mean by the spiritual level is the level of focus that you have.

When a person is reading their prayer then they should think of Allah the High throughout. However this is not easy in the beginning as the evil devil will put all kinds of thoughts in your mind to distract you. Therefore to reach that level you must be slowly trained step by step until you are completely thinking about Allah.







#### The summary of all the things you need to do


1) To be sorry and to make a fresh start (Taubah)

Firstly you must seek forgiveness from all those people that live close and around you, and in addition to them, those people which you have done bad things to with your tongue. For example talking bad behind someone's back, hurting someone's feelings, false accusations, lying or any other sin that you have done with the tongue that affects other people. After that you should read 2 units of prayer of making a fresh start (Salat-u-Taubah), with all its conditions and ask for forgiveness from Allah The Most High. After that make a strong intention never to commit that sin again. (For more details of this please read page number 92).

2) Dhikr & Muraaqabah (Talking to Allah with heart)
(For more details of this please read page number 174).

(After 7 weeks of doing the Dhikr and Muraaqabah start the sheets below)

- 3) The sheet of the sins of the tongue (For more details of this please read page number 201).
- 4) You should also put a tick or cross on the sincerity sheet. (For more details of this please read page number 219)
- 5) You should also put a tick or a cross on the spiritual levels of prayer sheet. (For more details of this please read page number 302).
- 6) You should also put a tick or cross on the Sunnah sheet for eating and drinking. (For more details please read page number 208).
- 7) To try to attend a good gathering once a week for example in the Mosque.
- 8) You should see your teacher, once every two months and show him your book so that he knows how far you have reached. You should act upon whatever he tells you to do aswell.



- 5) Importance of Dhikr / Muraaqabah (Personal Amaal).
- i) Dhikr / Muraaqabah it is energy source, without it all remains lifeless.
- ii) Purpose of dhikr for purification purposes, not reward.
- iii) Explain concept of attuning (preparing) before dhikr / meditation.
- iv) Firstly, breathe, relax and sit comfortably (but respectfully) so that you are calm.
- v) Close your eyes and use the '3 keys' 'Allah is with me, Allah is watching me, Allah is hearing me.' Repeat them a few times and think about the meaning.
- vi) Recite full 'Bismillah....'
- vii) Recite any words of repentance e.g. Astaghfirullah.
- viii) Recite durood upon the Prophet (Sallallhu-alayhe-wasallam) with the tongue and heart.
- iv) Finally, begin your Dhikr/ meditation as prescribed.
- v) Bad effects of not preparing very little benefit, no purification, no fez.
- 6) After 7 weeks prescribe and explain:
- i) Tongue sheet.
- ii) Sincerity Sheet.
- ii) Sunnah eating sheet.
